2018 PLEASURE CRAFT TOLLS

The tolls apply only to pleasure crafts up to 300 gross registered tonnes. Larger crafts are subject to the regular tolls payable under the *Seaway Schedule of Tolls* which is included in the *Seaway Handbook*, together with the *Seaway Practices and Procedures*. The *Handbook* is available on the internet at www.greatlakes-seaway.com.

Pleasure Craft Tolls:	\$30 per lock
Accepted methods of payment :	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Electronic payment with Paypal or Secunik (\$5 rebate).2. Cash (exact currency only in Canadian or US dollars) to hand over to the lock personnel.3. Credit card via the timestamps.

Credit card payments

For payments by credit cards, users must purchase a ticket at one of the automatic ticket dispensers which are located at both ends of each lock in the Montreal/Lake Ontario section as well as at either end of the Welland Canal. The dispensers accept credit cards only.

Electronic payments



Tickets can be purchased in advance, either online with **PayPal** or using the **Secunik** mobile app. There is a reduction of \$5 on the regular rate for users who take advantage of the electronic payment option.

Secunik is available on most smartphones. You can download the application on your phone from the following links:

Purchase and presentation of tickets for transits

For locks in the Montreal/Lake Ontario section, one ticket per lock transit is required, with the exception of the Beauharnois Locks, where a single ticket (at a price equivalent to two locks) is valid for transit of both the lower and upper Beauharnois Locks.

The ticket shall be presented to the officer in charge at each lock. In Beauharnois, the ticket is collected at the lower lock.

For the Welland Canal, a single ticket (at a price equivalent to eight locks) is applicable to the transit of the eight locks, and this ticket shall be presented to the lock personnel at Lock 8.

Boaters who use PayPal shall present a separate ticket for each transit. The ticket shall be printed and presented to the lock personnel.

If an electronic ticket has been purchased in Secunik app, lock staff will validate the ticket from a mobile device by identifying the pleasure craft.

Cash payments

Cash payments are accepted in 2018. However, users should note that this payment method could be abolished as of 2019.

Transits in US Locks

Tools at US Locks:	\$30 per lock
Accepted methods of payment:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Cash (exact currency only in Canadian or US dollars) to be given to local staff.2. Credit card via the government website (see link below).

American locks do not accept credit cards nor sell tickets at the locks.

At the American locks in the Montreal/Lake Ontario section, tolls for Upbound crafts are collected by the officer in charge at the Bertrand H. Snell Lock. Tolls for Downbound crafts are collected by the officer in charge at the Dwight D. Eisenhower Lock.

Users who pay cash are asked to provide the exact amount. No premium will be allowed for currency exchange rates.
