SEAWAY RADIO MESSAGE NO. 6 – 2024

Mariners are advised that the Montreal-Lake Ontario and Welland Canal drafts are as outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024.

It is important for mariners to note that any vessel which enters the Seaway upbound at CIP2 shall be designated a wintering vessel in accordance with all the terms outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024.

In addition, the implementation of the power to length ratio restrictions and minimum draft requirements, scheduled for December 7, will be postponed until further notice.

Water temperature at St. Lambert on December 16, is -0.9 degrees Celsius. Last year's temperature was 1.2 degrees Celsius. The ten years average is 1.2 degrees Celsius.

At midnight December 16, the number of ocean vessels above St. Lambert was 63 as compared to 31 in 2023. Above Port Weller the number was 39 as compared to 20 in 2023.

The Prescott/Ogdensburg ice boom opening has been reduced to 600m and is indicated by quick flashing green and red buoys.

All closing procedures outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024 remain in effect.

The next radio message will be issued Tuesday, December 17, 2024.

The Seaway Control centre will only broadcast critical information on the air.
