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### **SEAWAY RADIO MESSAGE NO. 11 – 2024**

Mariners are advised that the Montreal-Lake Ontario and Welland Canal drafts are as outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024.

It is important for mariners to note that any vessel which enters the Seaway upbound at CIP2 shall be designated a wintering vessel in accordance with all the terms outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024.

In addition, the implementation of the power to length ratio restrictions and minimum draft requirements, scheduled to begin December 7 and December 12, are be postponed until further notice.

**Ice is forming at St-Lambert and Côte St-Catherine locks in the Montreal-Lake Ontario section, and in the Wiley-Dondero canal, more detailed information may be obtained from the respective Traffic Control Centre.**

Water temperature at St. Lambert on December 23, is 0 degree Celsius. Last year's temperature was 1.2 degree Celsius. The ten years average is 0.6 degree Celsius.

At midnight December 23, the number of ocean vessels above St. Lambert was 34 as compared to 19 in 2023. Above Port Weller the number was 19 as compared to 11 in 2023.

The Prescott/Ogdensburg ice boom opening has been reduced to 600m and is indicated by quick flashing green and red buoys.

All closing procedures outlined in Seaway Notice No. 12 of 2024 remain in effect.

The next radio message will be issued Tuesday, December 24, 2024.

The Seaway Control centre will only broadcast critical information on the air.
